- SB 390 (Umberg) – Requires all Security Guards working on the property of a K-12 or community college district to complete the School Security Guard training
- SB 609 (Glazer) – Extends the Bureau’s sunset date until January 1, 2024; combines the Private Investigator and Private Security Services Funds; makes adjustments in the Private Investigator Act fee schedule; requires applicants for an exposed Firearms Permit to be at least 21 years of age; requires every Security Guard registrant to complete the annual continued education training; makes other technical changes to the Practice Acts
- AB 5 (Gonzalez) – Codifies the *Dynamex Operations West, Inc v. Superior Court of Los Angeles (2018)* ruling by clarifying the criteria to be used when classifying a worker as an employee or independent contractor
- AB 61 (Ting, Muratsuchi, and Reyes) – Expands the category of individuals that can file a petition for an ex parte, one-year, or renewed gun violence restraining order
- AB 1289 (Chen) – Prohibits local jurisdictions from fining Alarm Company Operators (ACOs) when requesting dispatch to a customer who does not have a local use permit if it was not the responsibility of the ACO to obtain the permit.
